This is a photograph of Ingrow West Station. It is one of the stations on the **Keighley and Worth Valley Railway.** 

The station building has not been here very long. It came from another station, called Foulridge, in Lancashire. Foulridge did not need a station building, so it was pulled down, stone by stone, and each stone was given a number. The stones were loaded onto lorries and brought to Ingrow. Here they were put together again, like a jigsaw puzzle, in order to re-create the station building.
