This stone PLAQUE was put up in memory of a man who gave great support to the Railway.	This stone was laid by T. GEOFFREY REEDAY. LL.B., F.C.I.S., F.I.B., Barrister. Benefactor of this Railway. on 8th November 1986.
This yard CRANE was used to load and unload lorries and wagons in the station yard.	
The steel railway track is laid on wooden sleepers to keep it flat. A train can move from one track to another by using POINTS. They have to be changed by pulling levers.	
Notice the sloping palings on the station FENCE. This design was used by the Midland Railway.	
This platform garden planter was made from railway SLEEPERS.
